By-law No. 2021-22

Being A By-law to Regulate the Collection, Removal, Recycling and Disposal of Waste in the Corporation of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula

Whereas Section 8 of the Municipal Act, 2001, as amended, provides that Section 8 shall be interpreted broadly so as to confer broad authority on the municipality to enable the municipality to govern its affairs as it considers appropriate and to enhance the municipality's ability to respond to municipal issues;

And whereas Section 9 of the Municipal Act, 2001, as amended, provides that a municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purpose of exercising its authority under this or any other Act;

And whereas Section 11 of the Municipal Act, 2001, as amended, provides that a municipality may provide any service or thing that the municipality considers necessary or desirable for the public and may pass By-laws regarding waste management;

And whereas the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula deems it expedient to establish, maintain and regulate a system for the disposal of waste and the recycling of waste materials and to establish and maintain a system for the collection, removal and disposal of garbage;

Now therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula enacts as follows:

1. Definitions

- 1.1. Active Area shall mean the part of a waste disposal site that has received or is receiving waste and has not yet received final cover.
- 1.2. Approved Container shall mean in the case of weekly garbage collection, a bin, box or similar container designed to hold garbage in a secure manner, protected from the elements and vermin, in such a fashion as to allow for safe pick-up by the Municipality's Collection Contractor.
- 1.3. Approved Permanent Container shall mean in the case of weekly garbage and recycling collection, a bin, box or similar container permanently affixed and designed to hold garbage and recyclable materials in a secure manner, protected from the elements and vermin, in such a fashion as to allow for safe pick-up by the Municipality's Collection Contractor.
- 1.4. Ashes shall mean the solid residue of any fuel for heating or cooking purposes, and soot or other cleanings from chimneys, fireplaces or heating appliances.
- 1.5. Bag Limit shall mean not more than two garbage bags per improved property.
- 1.6. Bale Wrap shall mean white, solid plastic wrap used for the purpose of storage of bales of hay, grains or silage.

- 1.7. Blue Box Container shall mean in the case of weekly recycling collection, a bin, box or similar container, not exceeding 23 gallons in size, designed to hold recyclable materials in a secure manner and in such a fashion as to allow for safe pick-up by the Municipality's Collection Contractor.
- 1.8. Blue Box Recyclable Materials shall mean materials accepted under the Municipality's recycling program and that are collected via weekly curbside collection or deposited at the Municipality's Recycling Depots, as per Schedule 'C', as amended from time to time.
- 1.9. Boxboard shall mean non-corrugated cardboard.
- 1.10. Burn Area shall mean the area in a waste disposal site designated by signs or otherwise for the purpose of burning.
- 1.11. By-law Enforcement Officer shall mean a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer appointed to enforce the by-laws of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula.
- 1.12. Cardboard shall include only clean, dry corrugated cardboard, excluding all wax or plastic coated cardboard and boxboard.
- 1.13. Collection Contractor shall mean the person(s), limited company or corporation retained by the Municipality to collect, remove, transport and deliver waste and recyclable materials.
- 1.14. Commercial shall be as defined within the Zoning By-law for the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula, as amended from time to time.
- 1.15. Contaminated Soil shall mean soil contaminated by previous use or activity that meets the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks approval, as determined by Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedure (TCLP) testing methodology, for disposal in a municipal waste disposal site and originates within the boundaries of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula, unless otherwise authorized by the Municipality.
- 1.16. Council shall mean the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula.
- 1.17. County shall mean the Corporation of the County of Bruce.
- 1.18. Designated Area shall mean locations within the waste disposal sites as designated by signs or otherwise.
- 1.19. Disposable Waste Materials shall mean and include garbage and refuse and solid non-hazardous household waste.
- 1.20. Drywall shall mean clean drywall free of paint, fasteners, wood or other deleterious material.
- 1.21. Electronic Recycling Area shall mean the area of a waste disposal site designated by signs or otherwise for the purpose of recycling electronic waste, and as outlined in Schedule 'D' of this By-law.

- 1.22. Fill Area shall mean the operative area of a waste disposal site as designated by sign or otherwise.
- 1.23. Garbage shall mean solid non-hazardous household waste and shall include the receptacles and wrappings in which the same is placed. Garbage shall not include recyclable materials, leaf and yard waste or hazardous waste.
- 1.24. Garbage Bags shall mean bags manufactured for the purpose of garbage disposal, having a maximum size of 30" by 38" (76.2 cm by 96.52 cm) or a weight not to exceed 50 lbs (22 kg).
- 1.25. Garbage Packer Truck shall mean a truck with an enclosed load-carrying receptacle and machinery used to compact the load.
- 1.26. Hazardous Waste shall mean waste that poses substantial or potential threats to public health or environment and generally exhibits one or more of the following characteristics: ignitable, flammable, oxidizing, corrosive, toxic, radioactive or explosive.
- 1.27. Household Waste shall mean solid non-hazardous municipal waste and includes products normally generated by a residential use on a regular basis but shall not include recyclable materials, leaf and yard waste, hazardous waste or items such as furniture, construction materials, automotive materials or electronics.
- 1.28. Improved Property shall mean any parcel of land containing a structure or facility built for residential use, and includes buildings which are subdivided into no more than two separate residences. Improved property excludes structures or facilities used for agricultural, industrial, commercial and institutional purposes and medium density residential properties.
- 1.29. Indicator System shall mean the method of notifying the Collection Contractor that waste and/or recycling has been placed in a permanent approved container for pick-up. The preferred method would be the flag up/flag down method, where a raised flag indicates waste is ready for collection.
- 1.30. Industrial shall mean anything pertaining to premises wherein processing, preparation or manufacturing is carried out.
- 1.31. Leaf and Yard Waste shall mean organic matter, including garden trimmings, hedge trimmings, leaves, fall leaves, brush and vegetable and plant matter, to be disposed of which originated in the normal maintenance of a residential yard.
- 1.32. Medium Density Residential shall mean triplexes, four-plexus, townhouses, row houses, three storey apartments, converted dwellings of three or more units, and similar multi-unit forms of housing, as outlined in the Official Plan for the Tobermory, Lion's Head Secondary Urban Areas and the Hamlet of Ferndale.
- 1.33. Multi-Use Property shall mean any parcel of land containing a structure or facility built for both residential and commercial uses and/or multi-residential properties containing more than two units.
- 1.34. Municipality shall mean the Corporation of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula.

- 1.35. Occupier shall mean a person who is in physical possession of premises or who has responsibility for or control over the condition of premises or the activities there carried on, or control over persons allowed to enter the premises.
- 1.36. Operating Authority shall mean the Corporation of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula or its authorized representatives.
- 1.37. Owner shall include the occupant of the property who has care and control of same from time to time, and shall also include a lessee or occupant of the property who under the terms of the lease is required to repair and maintain the property in accordance with municipal by-laws.
- 1.38. Recycling Depot shall mean a location with bulk containers provided by the Municipality for the collection of Blue Box recyclable materials to be deposited by the occupants of commercial, industrial, institutional and residential premises located within the Municipality.
- 1.39. Refuse shall mean and include all waste materials such as broken crockery and glass, jars, bottles, bones, discarded wearing apparel and all kinds of refuse not subject to decay other than those items accepted as recycling.
- 1.40. Residential Waste shall mean solid non-hazardous household waste expected to be collected from any residence and improved property including a farm residence.
- 1.41. Scavenging shall mean the unauthorized removal of materials from a waste disposal site, recycling depot, waste disposal bin or from the curb where such waste is set for pick-up.
- 1.42. Scrap Metal Area shall mean the area of a waste disposal site designated by signs or otherwise for the disposal of metal, steel, iron, aluminum or other metallic materials.
- 1.43. Tipping Fees shall be a waste disposal fee, as established by the Fees and Charges By-law, as amended from time to time.
- 1.44. Tire Storage Area shall mean the area in a waste disposal site designated by signs or otherwise for the purpose of placing tires.
- 1.45. Waste shall mean solid non-hazardous municipal waste, such as garbage, refuse and other materials approved for disposal by the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks.
- 1.46. Waste Disposal Attendant shall mean the employee(s) or agent(s) appointed by Council responsible for the supervision and operation of the Waste Disposal Sites and for the administration of this By-law.
- 1.47. Waste Disposal Bins shall mean the metal bins placed by the operating authority or its designate at locations throughout the Municipality.
- 1.48. Waste Disposal Site shall mean a waste disposal site designated and operated by the Corporation of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula for the disposal or transfer of waste in accordance with the provisions of this By-law and

the terms and conditions of a Certificate of Approval issued by the Ministry of the Environment, Parks and Conservation.

- 1.49. White Metal Area shall mean the area of a waste disposal site designated by signs or otherwise for the purpose of recycling white metal.

For the purpose of this By-law, the definitions and interpretations given in this By-law shall govern. In this By-law, "shall" is mandatory; words in the singular include the plural words and words in the plural include the singular; words used in the masculine gender include the feminine.

2. Scope

- 2.1. The provisions of this By-law shall apply to persons, lands, structures and uses within the boundaries of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula.
- 2.2. No person shall dispose of, or cause to be disposed of, any waste, recyclable, refuse or garbage except in conformity with the provisions of this By-law and schedules attached hereto.

3. Storage of Disposable Waste Material on Premises

- 3.1. No person(s) in charge of a premise shall store or permit to be stored on any premise garbage, refuse, household waste or disposable waste materials of any kind in sufficient quantities so as to create a nuisance in terms of odour, attractions of vermin, wind impact or similar, and shall ensure that said material is secured within properly designed containers that can be emptied, cleaned and otherwise maintained in a sanitary condition including the lands upon which the waste sits.
- 3.2. Every person shall store garbage on a premise in accordance with Section 3.1 of this By-law, until such a time as placed at the road side for pick-up by the Municipality's Collection Contractor in accordance with the time periods set out in Section 4 of this By-law where appropriate, or until pick-up by an approved waste hauler hired by the owner or occupant of a premises.

4. Curbside Garbage and Blue Box Recycling Collection

- 4.1. The Collection Contractor shall pick-up household waste and Blue Box recyclable materials from the roadside or boulevard in front of improved properties and occupied premises, on Mondays beginning no earlier than 8:00 a.m. Curbside garbage and recycling collection shall be conducted throughout the entire Municipality. Schedule 'I' sets out the roads within the Municipality that will not receive direct curbside collection of waste and recyclable materials and the alternative method available.
- 4.2. No person(s) shall leave or permit to be left any disposable waste or Blue Box recyclable materials not collected at the roadside or boulevard under Section 4.1 and shall ensure the prompt clean up and removal of said material.
- 4.3. When curbside collection cannot be made on the regular day as prescribed in Section 4.1, due to the incidence of holidays or for any other reason, the occupants of premises affected thereby shall be notified, and all disposal waste and Blue Box recyclable materials shall be promptly removed from the roadside

and securely stored in a neat and tidy manner on the owner's premise in accordance with Section 3.1 until the next approved pick-up day.

- 4.4. No person(s) shall place for pick-up any items other than household waste and Blue Box recyclable materials, as defined within this By-law.
- 4.5. The Municipality may determine whether any improved property shall receive garbage and recycling collection services and may conclude that roadside pick-up is not in the best interest of the Municipality due to safety, access, excessive cost or any other condition which the Municipality believes is relevant.
- 4.6. The Municipality reserves the right to alter the collection schedule and type of service being offered.

5. Placement of Garbage and Blue Box Materials for Pick-up

- 5.1. Garbage bags containing disposable waste materials and Blue Box containers, containing Blue Box recyclable items, shall be placed at the curb, or in approved containers, on the roadside boulevard or adjacent to the improved property by all owners or occupants prior to 8:00 a.m. on the day of collection. In the case of those Owners not using an approved container to house their waste, they shall not set out garbage prior to 6:00 a.m.

Approved permanent containers shall be located at the edge of the municipal road allowance such that it will not encumber the operation of maintenance vehicles/equipment.

For improved lots which house approved containers which are permanently fixed, owners are requested to follow the Indicator System, as defined within this By-law.

During the winter months, pathways must be maintained clear of snow and ice where necessary to permit convenient access to an approved container or garbage bag(s) and Blue Boxes placed for collection.

In the case of premises situated on streets which may not be open for traffic during winter months, approved containers or garbage bags and Blue Box containers shall be placed by the occupant at an approved location, previously determined by the Municipality.

The Municipality encompasses a single-stream (commingled) system for its Blue Box recyclable materials. Materials do not have to be sorted and shall be placed in a Blue Box container, as defined within this By-law.

- 5.2. No person(s) shall allow garbage, approved containers, Blue Box containers or any disposable waste materials not collected by the Collection Contractor to remain in the location specified in Section 5.1 after 8:00 p.m. on the specified collection day, with the exception of those approved containers which are permanently placed.
- 5.3. Owners shall be responsible for disposable waste materials and Blue Box recyclable materials until such time as they are picked up. Owners are responsible for approved containers, garbage bags and Blue Box recyclable materials that are improperly packaged or are damaged or broken in such a

manner that the contents are no longer contained therein, and shall promptly clean any remaining material not collected by the Corporation or its agents.

- 5.4. No person(s) shall dump or place any disposable waste materials or Blue Box recyclable materials at the following locations, with the exception of those circumstances listed in Section 5.1:
 - a. At a premise other than their own premise; or
 - b. Alongside Municipal, County, Provincial or Federal property within the Municipality, including fully maintained, seasonally-maintained and non-maintained roads, road allowances and public walkways.
- 5.5. Staff of the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula may open such bags of garbage that are found in receptacles, on streets, ditches or on any Municipal property where waste has been disposed and upon finding proof that person did so dispose of such waste, a By-law Enforcement Officer shall be notified and lay charges. A service charge, as outlined in the Fees and Charges By-law, shall be charged to the person whose garbage was opened and proof discovered sufficient to lay charges.
- 5.6. Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 5.4 of this By-law, the dumping of disposable waste materials shall be permitted at the Municipality's approved Waste Disposal Sites.

6. Waste Disposal Bins

- 6.1. Waste disposal bins shall be placed at designated areas throughout the Municipality for its facilities and use by Municipal staff.
- 6.2. No person shall dispose of any waste in any waste disposal bin without previous authorization from the Municipality.
- 6.3. No person shall leave, or permit to leave any waste, refuse or recyclable materials whatsoever outside and/or around a waste disposal bin.
- 6.4. No person shall place any form of advertising or literature on a waste disposal bin without prior approval from the Municipality.
- 6.5. No person shall vandalize or cause the destruction of a waste disposal bin.

7. Recycling Depots

- 7.1. Recycling Depots for the collection of Blue Box recyclable materials are available at the following locations:

Eastnor Waste Disposal Site	1252 West Road
Lindsay Waste Disposal Site	627 Ira Lake Road
St. Edmunds Waste Disposal Site	71 McArthur Road

- 7.2. Blue Box recyclable materials can be deposited at the Waste Disposal Sites during regular hours of operation, as outlined in Schedule 'A'.
- 7.3. Blue Box recyclable materials shall be disposed of in the single stream in the appropriate containers provided.

- 7.4. Containers shall be used solely for the disposal of Blue Box recyclable materials. No person(s) shall place household waste in any container marked for recyclable materials.

8. Interference

- 8.1. No person shall pick over, interfere with, disturb, remove or scatter any disposable waste material or other container therefore placed for removal in accordance with this By-law, whether the same is contained in an approved container or otherwise, unless said person is a representative of the Municipality authorized for garbage and recycling collection, or a person authorized by the owner or occupant to remove the garbage of the said owner or occupant.

9. Waste Disposal Site Operation

No person shall place waste at or use the Municipal Waste Disposal Sites except in accordance with the following provisions:

- 9.1. Within the approved hours of operation (and/or when a Municipal official is on site) and within designated areas as set out by the Municipality from time to time.
- 9.2. In accordance with the parameters set out by the 'Attention' sign located at the entrance to each Waste Disposal Site. Such sign shall indicate the type of waste accepted or refused, proper use of a waste disposal site as well as liability and emergency contact information.
- 9.3. All persons must report to the landfill scale house and attendant prior to the disposal of any waste materials or removal of reusable items.
- 9.4. Unless authorized by the Municipality to access the Sites, such as the Collection Contractor, or any other persons, as previously approved by the Public Works Manager and/or his/her designate.
- 9.5. Paying applicable rates for the disposal of materials as set out in the Municipality's Fees and Charges By-law, as amended from time to time, unless otherwise previously approved by the Municipality.
- 9.6. Any person requesting a waste disposal site be opened on any hours other than the normal operating hours shall make arrangements with the Public Works Department, at the Municipal Office located at 56 Lindsay Road 5, and may pay a fee, plus applicable tipping fees. Thereafter, an additional fee may be charged for the duration of time a waste disposal site remains open for the disposal of waste outside of normal hours of operation.
- 9.7. The Municipality reserves the right to restrict access to any individual or firm as a result of contravention(s) to this By-law.

10. Household Hazardous Waste

- 10.1. No person shall include any household hazardous waste materials within their disposable waste materials whether collected by the Collection Contractor or deposited at a Municipal Waste Disposal Site. Such materials will be collected

by Bruce County Highways Department during an approved Bruce County Household Hazardous Waste Event, as scheduled by the County on a yearly basis.

11. Unauthorized Persons

- 11.1. No person shall enter a Waste Disposal Site for any purpose other than dumping disposable waste materials in permitted areas without prior approval of the operating authority.

12. Scavenging

- 12.1. No person shall scavenge at a Waste Disposal Site or at the roadside except as described in Section 12.2.
- 12.2. Materials may be dropped off, with permission of a Waste Disposal Site attendant, at a Re-Use Building located at the Waste Disposal Sites, as per Schedule 'G'. Materials may be freely removed by any visitor to a Waste Disposal Site.

13. Disposal Fee Schedule

- 13.1. Fees levied at a Waste Disposal Site shall be in accordance with the Municipality's Fees and Charges By-law for the current year.
- 13.2. Fees levied at a Waste Disposal Site shall be payable by cash, debit or credit, by cheque or pre-approved account, unless as pre-authorized by the Municipality. Receipts will be issued by the attendant for the charge levied to the operator of each vehicle using the facility.
- 13.3. Pre-approved account holders may be restricted from waste disposal site use for failure to submit payment on past due accounts.

14. Acceptable Waste

- 14.1. Only solid non-hazardous municipal waste shall be received at a waste disposal site. No industrial waste or hazardous waste shall be disposed of, under Ontario Regulation 347 or any other Federal or Provincial regulations that apply thereto, or at the curbside for collection by the Collection Contractor. Violations will be promptly reported to the Municipality's By-law Enforcement Officer or other authorized enforcement authority for investigation.
- 14.2. No person shall dump disposable waste materials at a waste disposal site except disposable waste materials coming from a source located within the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula, unless previously approved by the Municipality.
- 14.3. Waste shall be sorted and disposed of in the designated areas of a waste disposal site, as per Schedule 'B' and 14.3 (a) through (j). Should waste not be sorted, an 'unsorted waste' tipping fee will be charged.
 - a. Natural wood (unfinished, unpainted, untreated) products in the area for Clean Wood;
 - b. Metal in the Scrap Metal Area;

- c. Tires including tires with rims in the Tire Area;
- d. Compostable yard waste and brush in the Brush Area;
- e. Recyclable materials including paper, cardboard, boxboard, empty cans and plastics of types 1-5 and 7 in the Recycling Containers;
- f. Plastic bale wrap in the Bale Wrap bin;
- g. Freon appliances in the Freon Appliances Area;
- h. Propane tanks in the Propane Tank Area; and
- i. All other disposable waste material in the Fill Area unless a specific dumping area exists with proper signage informing the dumper as to the required material type or as directed by scale house attendant or operating authority.

14.4. In cases where the type of disposable waste materials to be deposited at a Waste Disposal Site is questioned, the operating authority shall be the final ruling authority. The operating authority may consult the Ministry of the Environment, Parks and Conservation, if required.

15. Prohibited Wastes

15.1. No person shall dispose of any of the following prohibited items within the active fill area of the Waste Disposal Sites:

- a. Hazardous waste
- b. Recyclable materials
- c. Hot ashes
- d. Scrap/white metal
- e. Tires
- f. Fluorescent bulbs
- g. Electronic waste
- h. Mattresses
- i. Polystyrene

16. Enforcement and Penalties

16.1. This By-law shall be enforced by the Municipality's By-law Enforcement Officer and/or his/her designate, and the Ontario Provincial Police. For the purposes of enforcing the provisions of this By-law, By-law Enforcement Officers may inspect garbage and recycling placed on public property, on or near municipal road allowances, County roads or Provincial highways.

16.2. No person shall interfere with a By-law Enforcement Officer or an authorized person while carrying out his/her duties of enforcing this By-law.

16.3. Every person who contravenes any portion of this By-law is guilty of an offense and on conviction is liable to a fine as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O., 1990, c.P. 33.

16.4. In addition to prosecution under this By-law, the operating authority may prosecute violators of this By-law for trespass or exercise any other statutory or common rights.

16.5. In addition, or as an alternative to any preceding penalties, right of access to a waste disposal site and to garbage services may be denied to any individual or firm as a result of repeated offences of the provisions of this By-law.

16.6. Where an Officer has reasonable grounds to believe that a person has committed an offence under this By-law, the Officer may require the name, address and proof of identity of that person(s) and the person(s) shall supply the required information.

17. Short Title

17.1. The short title of this By-law shall be "Waste and Recycling By-law".

19. Effective Date

19.1. This By-law shall supersede and rescind any by-laws inconsistent with this By-law.

19.2. This By-law shall come into full force and take effect upon final passing thereof.

Designated Areas of Disposal

1. Burn Area – the following materials will be accepted for disposal in the Burn Area and will be subject to applicable tipping fees:

Clean wood

Brush

Tree branches

Any other clean wood product as determined by a Waste Disposal Site attendant.

2. Leaf Area – the following materials will be accepted for disposal in the Leaf Area:

Leaves

Grass clippings


